Mr. Barwick reviewed Study two options for the parking lot improvement project with an estimated cost. Option add 1 is to landscaping, lighting, add new curbing, adding asphalt, remove current

walkway. This option will increase parking spaces from sidewalk, and add new the current 81 spaces to 97. He displayed a diagram of the proposed plan. Option 2 includes making improvements to parking the existing lot and adding Convention and Visitors Bureau (CVB) structure. Parking new spaces will 81 to 89. Ms. Zartler stated that City Staff continues to work on the floor plans to best fit the needs of departments. The proposed building will be three stories approximately 44,500 sq. ft. Mr. Scott displayed his contextual inspiration the architecture. The stone used will be very similar to that of the library to of the buildings. The detention will as continuity two pond serve availability for a park like area between the Library and City Hall. He displayed conceptual design drawings of the proposed site plan and the proposed exterior and interior of the building. Ms. Zartler stated that the current Zoning Ordinance will prelude parking in front of building but could possibly make it a fire lane. There are archeological features located in the area that we will try to work around. Mr. Ron Bowman, City Manager stated that although the building looks tall, it is the same height as the Courthouse and City Center building downtown.
