18. COMMENTS FROM COUNCIL/LEGAL COUNSEL/STAFF – No discussion or action may take place.

Jeff Thompson, Deputy City Manager stated that the agreement for the Master

Plan with Burditt Consultants LLC will be on the next agenda for the City Council's consideration.

Colton Council Member Boyd recognized Schroeder who resides Council Member Boyd's district and neighborhood, was awarded Entrepreneur of the Year for Lemonade Day this year and received a \$1,000 scholarship. Council Member Boyd also asked city staff for a document to explain the variance to Ye Kendall Inn allowing the use of a golf cart in the city.

Council Member Anzollitto reported that he attended the AACOG Air Executive Committee meeting and it was asked that all surrounding communities participate with San Antonio in the clean air initiative even though Boerne does not contribute to air pollution in the area. This may be a good way to market Boerne as a clean air city.

Kirsten Cohoon, City Attorney announced that Fabra Elementary also received \$1,000.00 for Lemonade Day for the most participants.
