Mr. constant flow Mann stated that the retained the current 975 acre feet annual commitment since 2008. He displayed a graph of peak water production from year 2000 to Mr. present. Mann explained that once the commitment is increased, it can't be moved back **GBRA** water is significantly more expensive than that which down. produced from the lake or groundwater wells. It is Staff's recommendation to retain the current annual commitment from **GBRA** as long as possible. ensued regarding increasing the middle of the commitment in the year if necessary and increasing size of water treatment plant.
