He stated that he felt the proposed zoning is not consistent with the Master Plan and suggested the City enter into a development agreement with the developer.

Gillespie, 309 Breckenridge spoke Jenny in opposition to the proposed permanent zoning of 17 Herff Road. She remembers visiting Boerne and all she could see is trees, the creek, and being surrounded by nature. She stated that her son asked her why the City didn't protect the area? She asked the City Council to hold off on the decision and let people know about what is being planned for the property. Once the development happens, it is gone forever.

Vollmer, 524 North School Street spoke Dani in opposition to the proposed permanent zoning of 17 Herff Road. She asked that City Council not rush into a ves vote. She suggested that another location would be more suitable for the development rather than 17 Herff Road. She asked the City Council listen to and the community and vote against a land use that does the voters not respect the creek.

Bob Vollmer, 524 North School Street spoke in opposition to the proposed permanent zoning of 17 Herff Road. He requested the City Council vote no to proposed zoning. He referred to the information provided in the Planning the Zoning Commission packet and suggested that the usage doesn't fit. and He reminded the City Council that the City controls the zoning.

Highway 46 was identified as the largest corridor for freight movers. This has a huge impact on our community. He hoped that the community gets involved with the Kendall Gateway Project process.

Deputy City Manager Jeff Thompson stated that the tax credit application that went before City Council at the February 14, 2017 for the Cibolo Senior Gardens Housing project on Old San Antonio Road was recently withdrawn.

City Manager Ron Bowman stated that the property owner of the Main Street parking lot, which the City rents is requiring that City evacuate the premise and existing building within 30 days (April 7, 2017). remove the He updated the Council legislature filed by Senator Campbell City on regarding trees and Governor Abbott is proposing a broad base ban on regulations at annexation. He provided a list to the City Council of voters on Senate Bill 2 the local level. regarding Revenue Caps. Of the 31 Senators, 18 of the 19 Republicans voted for the Bill, one Republican and the 11 Democrats voted against. With future annexations, Staff will prepare a cost benefit analysis for the City Council in advance of the meeting.
