Mayor Schultz called on Mr. Mike Mann, Public Works Director. Mr. Mann stated that years ago there was water that couldn't be accounted for and the

City used SAMCO Leak Detection to detect the leak. The City's water system includes over 110 miles of pipe. Currently the City's records indicate unaccounted water numbers are increasing again. The City has received a price quote from SAMCO to again perform a study on the water system to verify any The study would include half of the system this year, which significant leaks. consists of older metallic lines with the intent to request budget funding for the other half of the system next fiscal year. Mr. Mann displayed a map of the proposed area of study. It is Staff's recommendation to conduct a routine detection annually. Discussion ensued regarding conducting a study the whole system and that Staff is looking for non-meter leaks rather than leaks that would be detected by AMI.

Schultz called Mr. Jeff Thompson, Deputy City Mr. on Manager. before City Council Thompson stated that the agreement is similar the Homes. agreement previously approved with Perry Highland Homes currently 91 undeveloped Ranches at Creekside subdivision. Mr. lots in the Highland Homes builds a home, Thompson explained that when they pay state and local sales tax to suppliers. Texas law requires suppliers to collect and remit local sales taxes where they have places of business and receive orders and not where thev deliver or use the materials. Highland Homes Payment Permit from the Comptroller's considering applying for a Texas Direct Office which allows a Texas company to pay a use tax on purchases of taxable materials according to the location where materials are used. The estimated benefit to the City based on 91 lots should net about \$607.50 per home or \$55,283 over the 10-year term of the agreement. Staff recommended approval of the Agreement with Highland Homes San Antonio, LLC and Resolution No. 2018-R06.
