### 3. PUBLIC COMMENTS:

Jeff Carroll stated he was speaking on behalf of Mr. Bill Walters, developer for Commons at Menger Creek who is currently out of the country. Agenda item 6 of the 15.54 acres located 20 Old rezoning at San Antonio Road. He stated the master development plan indicates more multifamily for the new which will drive dense commercial in front of the development. It area anticipated that the utilities will be extended to the property by the end year and they will begin selling lots at that time. Mr. Carroll stated they have received calls of interest on the property.

Joe McElyea, 139 Bluebonnet Circle spoke against the proposed apartment development on 110 Bluebonnet Circle. He was concerned with home values if the apartments are built, drainage, and traffic.

Marilyn Berry, 126 Bluebonnet Circle spoke in opposition of the rezoning of 110 Bluebonnet Circle. She stated that she agreed Boerne needed more affordable housing but opposed the apartment development. She referenced the must follow. Subdivision Ordinance which the developer Ms. Berry expressed concerns with additional traffic the development would create on the residential street, and the safety of children walking to school since there are a lack of sidewalks and lighting. She suggested the City Council consider the needs of the neighbors in the area.

Jeff Stewart, 228 Leather Leaf expressed opposition to the proposed rezoning of 110 Bluebonnet Circle. He noted that one of the co-owners withdrew from the project. He referenced marketing material from the developer which states the property value will go up in value with the development. He suggested that City Council postpone the vote until it is determined if Mr. Gonzalez owns the property.

Theresa Keenan, 213 English Oaks Circle state she was opposed to the rezoning of 110 Bluebonnet Circle due to the potential traffic increase to the area.

Phyllis Baacke, 238 English Oaks Circle spoke in opposition to the rezoning of 110 Bluebonnet Circle. She stated that English Oaks Subdivision backs up to Stone Creek and her neighbors have experienced flooding in past years. She was also concerned with the proposed three story apartment building blocking the views for Stone Creek and English Oaks Subdivision.

Jacqui Bradley, 159 Bluebonnet Circle expressed concerns with the proposed apartment development. She said the current subdivision has only one way in and one way out and adding 40 cars will cause significant traffic for the area. She also expressed concerns with the mature trees on the property.

Kirsten Cohoon, City Attorney spoke to agenda item 4D. She distributed Lemonade Day backpacks to the City Council. Ms. Cohoon stated that this will

be the fourth year the City of Boerne will host the nation-wide event. The event will be held on May 6, 2018. There are currently 65 youths who have registered.

Jan Sing, 106 Stone Creek Drive spoke in opposition to the proposed apartment development on 110 Bluebonnet Circle. She stated that her home flooded three years ago due to runoff. She asked that the City Council take into consideration those who have experienced flooding in the area.
